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MESSAGE FROM ADMIN

As the school year draws to a close and summer break approaches, we find ourselves reflecting on the remarkable journey we have shared. This 2024-2025 school year has been filled with opportunities for growth, discovery, and achievement for each member of our school community.

St. Theresa of Lisieux's wide array of extracurricular activities demonstrated many of these achievements as we brought home 8 YRAA banners in our Athletics program this year in: cross country, Rugby 7s, swimming, Jr.Girls' Basketball, rock climbing, baseball, Rugby 15s (Jr. and Sr.). We also had teams and athletes participate at OFSAA in baseball, Sr Boys Rugby 15s, and had athletes medal in table tennis, badminton, Jr. Boys' Rugby (Barbarians Cup) and Jr. Girls Swimming. Our competitive teams: Robotics, DECA, HOSA and Model UN participated in and experienced success at International and World Competitions this year. As we entered into June our nine councils have elected their executive teams for the 2025-2026 school year. Our Music students travelled to Boston in April to participate in the World Strides festival, with our Sr. Band winning a silver medal and the entire ensemble winning a "Best Spirit and Character Award'. We are immensely proud of all of our students and thankful to their teachers, coaches and moderators.

Our students continue to excel in their academic pursuits, with outstanding scores in both the OSSLT and EQAO. Two of our students earned medals at the York Region Science and Technology Fair in April: Matthew Shen (Gr. 11) won gold, his project title being: Explainable Artificial Intelligence to Diagnose Early Parkinson's Disease via Voice Analysis; Lucas Chan (Gr, 10) won silver for his project Reducing Carbon Emissions by Optimizing Traffic.

We are also proud to celebrate the outstanding success of our math department and the math contest program! A total of 469 students participated in 10 different mathematics contests offered by the University of Waterloo and the University of Toronto—an impressive turnout that marks one of the highest participation in our school board. Our students not only showed exceptional enthusiasm but also achieved remarkable results, with many earning individual awards and even monetary prizes for their outstanding performance. Several students were also invited to attend the prestigious math camp hosted by the University of Waterloo, further recognizing their talent and dedication. Congratulations to all participants on a phenomenal year of mathematical achievement!



Our staff and students engaged in many charitable activities this semester, including: our March Break service trip to Costa Rica, the L'Arche walk in May, the Business Luncheon which raised funds for Diabetes Canada and our Market Fair which raised funds for ShareLife. Staff and students also donated to the 360 Kids fundraiser An STL team comprised of Mr. Parente, Ms. Sabatini and Ms. Venditti spent a night out in the cold in March to raise money for 360 Kids. In total, the team raised just under S10,000 for youth experiencing homelessness in York Region. Thanks to the donors for their generosity!



All of these remarkable achievements would not be possible without the participation of our students and the leadership of our competent and committed St. Theresa of Lisieux staff. We were certainly able to hear the STL roar in our hallways this year!


